Certified Energy Management® Seminar

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) is pleased to host a five day comprehensive training seminar developed by the Association of Energy Engineers, which will conclude with the Certified Energy Manager (CEM®) exam. This package is offered by NYSERDA for only \$499 for K-12 Schools/State personnel or \$999 for participants from private organizations and includes the class, all class materials, administration fees associated with the exam, and breakfast and lunch for all five days. Please see below for CEM® Training eligibility requirements.

Eligibility*

The prerequisites to qualify for the certification process are designed to account for individual diversity in educational and practical experience. To take this training course and sit for the exam, all candidates must meet one of the following criteria:

- A four-year engineering or architectural degree, a registered Professional Engineer (P.E.), or a Registered Architect (R.A.), with at least three years of experience in energy engineering or energy management.
- A four-year business or related degree, with at least five years of experience in energy engineering or energy management.
- A two-year technical degree, with eight years of experience in energy engineering or energy management.
- Ten years* or more verified experience in energy engineering or energy management.

Note: Letters of reference and verification of employment must be submitted.

HEATING PLANT Maintenance tips for residential multifamily building owners, property managers, and building superintendents

Those of you that are facility managers of multifamily properties have the busiest time of the year coming up. Over the years, we've accumulated a number of strong tips to ensure your heating system works effectively, efficiently – and, won't break down in the middle of a January night!

Weekly heating plant maintenance tips:

- Blow down all water valves as needed, and if your boiler water is chemically treated, check chemical levels. Not having desired chemical levels (when needed) will contribute to corrosion and lessen the life of your system.
- Check the oil strainer for any impurities.
- Make sure the fire eye and smoke detector lenses are clean. If not, use a soft cloth to gently clean the detector surfaces. Test your fire eye sensor by placing a flat thin object between the sensor and light source (such as a clipboard). If you can't hear your fire eye warning alarm buzzing, call your contractor. If you hear the alarm buzzing, wait for 90-120 seconds and make sure that the system goes into automatic shut-down. If system is not shutting down, call your contractor to diagnose and repair as needed.
- Check for sign of soot in the fire chamber, around the tubes (if applicable), and heat exchanger areas. For a boiler to effectively transfer heat, the combustion chamber must be kept clean of soot build-up. Soot build-up arises as a by-product of the normal function of the combustion chamber. But soot also acts as a natural insulator. Every 1/16" of soot build-up reduces boiler efficiency by 4.5%.
- Check the flame color. Healthy fuel/air mix will make your system more efficient, while a lazy orange flame indicates problems with your fuel/air mix.
- Check if the barometric damper is operating properly.
- Check the combustion efficiency of your boiler. Low efficiency means money going up the chimney, as well as all the warmth you desired from your system.
- Check level of lubrication in all motors, burners, and lubricate as necessary.
- Check the heat timer/controller settings, pins and clock time (if applicable).
- Check operation of the low water cut-off by blowing down valve. If your low water cutoff is not operating properly, call your contractor immediately. Clean the burner fuel nozzle before the heating season. Keep the boiler room clean of any loose debris. Make sure fresh air intakes are not clogged with leaves and other debris.
- Check for chimney soot build-up, and get the chimney cleaned if necessary.
